

Camp BUI Etiquette

1. Dues – Dues are \$60 if you place your tent under the structure and \$50 if you place your tent out from under the structure or sleep in a trailer. The dues pay for structure upkeep, ice, common goods, Shot of the Day, and much more.
2. Water- Each person is responsible for bringing sufficient drinking water to last them the week. We will keep a large 3 gallon thermos full of drinking water so you can stay hydrated. You should also bring enough water for showering and washing dishes.
3. Structure – set-up and take-down - Everyone is expected to play a part in the setup and takedown of the shade structure. This shade is for the benefit of everyone in the camp, whether you tent under it or not. So, please do your part – no exceptions.
4. Meals – We all chip in for dinners. Juggernaut will send out a kitchen duty spreadsheet a couple of months before the burn. Please fill that out as soon as you can. A typical meal duty for the week involves contributing an entrée and a salad, dessert, and one KP duty per person. We eat very well in the middle of the desert! There will be a copy of the kitchen duty spreadsheet up in the kitchen area, so no excuses for missing a meal duty.
5. Dinner – Dinner is at 7:00 - if you know you are not going to be around camp for dinner, please look on the chart to find out who is cooking the meal and let them know you are not going to be there.
6. Breakfast and lunch – you are on your own – but there is always food to be shared
7. Kitchen – keep the kitchen area clean – while folks are cleaning up, stay away! Put things away. If you need something, ask an Olphart.
8. Ice – we do an ice run almost every morning. If you expect to have your ice chest serviced, be there or make arrangements with someone in camp. Otherwise, your food is going down.
9. Quiet Time – Some in our camp hit the sack early, so when you come in off the playa at night, please keep the noise down to a very minimum. In the morning, low and quiet voice until at least 10:00.
10. Bikes – park your bikes out of the way. We have two bike racks – try to get your bike into one of them.
11. Showers – Navy showers only - NO EXCEPTION – and only biodegradable soap – we will provide Dr. Bronner's. One of our major hurdles each year is waste water (Grey water from kitchen and shower) Please use water very sparingly – we must haul out all waste water. Bring body wipes so you don't have to shower every day.
12. Shot of the Day – 6:45 each day. You won't want to miss this! We blow a marine horn and people from all the surrounding camps flock over for a unique shot of hooch.

13. Sunset – a time of celebration – Join TBD as we usher in the night. The party literally begins when the sun goes down. This is when the lights go on and the fire comes out.
14. Pineapple Upside Down Cake Thursday – this event is our camp sponsored event and is published in the main Burning Man event handbook. We expect hundreds of visitors so everyone in camp is expected to participate in some way or another. The event is from 2 to 4 on Thursday. We need people to help make the cakes, help serve the cakes, help serve the shot, direct people, chat folks up. This is a very fun event.
15. MOOP – pick it up. Before we leave we must do a complete sweep of the grounds. Pick up every thread, button, anything that does not belong. We have been green every year and it is our intent to stay that way (yes, they check when it is all over). Everyone must participate.
